Students at ASYV benefit from an unparalleled education. Unlike most schools in Rwanda, our Liquidnet Family High School is committed to providing a student-centered learning experience. By encouraging critical thinking instead of rote memorization, we transform our kids into capable problem solvers ready to lead wherever life takes them.

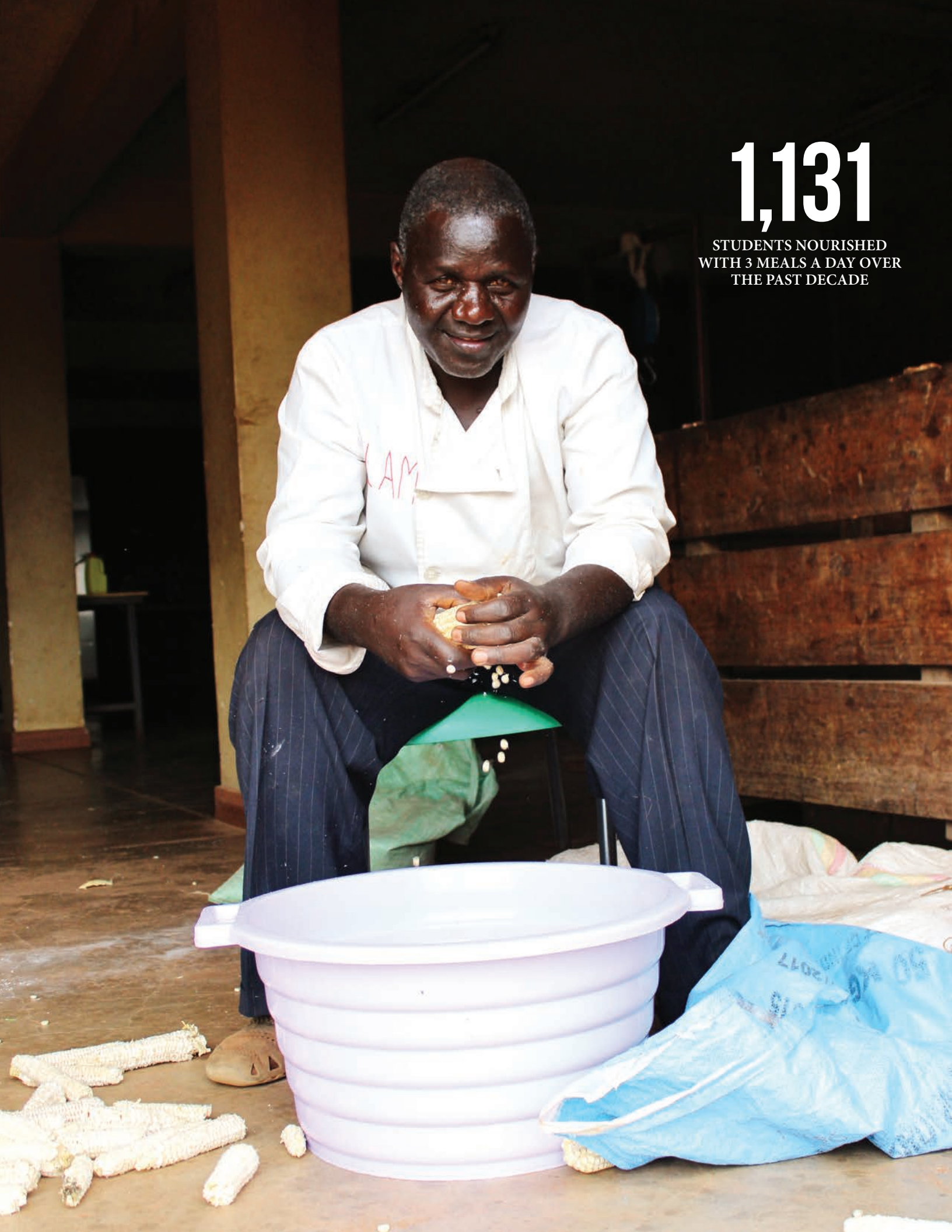
98% of our Class of 2016 graduates passed Rwanda's national exam. By passing at a rate 10% higher than the national average of 88%, a figure which includes all Rwandan youth, not just the most vulnerable, our students have demonstrated that everyone has the potential to succeed when given the right support.

HEALTH & WELLNESS

The Barry Segal Health & Wellness Center delivers the best in both health care and health education. While treating chronic conditions like HIV and depression, ASYV’s nurses and social workers also teach our students how to make informed and self-affirming decisions by leading workshops focused on such topics as sex education and stress management.

ENRICHMENT

Encompassing a variety of extracurricular activities, ASYV's enrichment programs allow our students to discover themselves by exploring newfound talents in science, athletics, and the arts. Ranging from student-run clubs to public service opportunities, enrichment programs teach our kids that they each have something to offer.

SERVICE AT ASYV

Community service, referred to in the Village by the Hebrew term *Tikkun Olam*, is a key facet of ASYV's enrichment programming and is interwoven into many aspects of Village life.

- Weekly *Tikkun Olam* programming gives our students the opportunity to lend support to the Village's surrounding community. Projects have included building homes, renovating classrooms, and teaching English to local schoolkids.
- English-speaking volunteer Fellows, known to our students as 'cousins', live in the Village for an extended period and serve as an embodiment of *Tikkun Olam*. By fostering our students' leadership and language skills, and by expanding their understanding of the world beyond Rwanda, the Fellows bring our kids new perspectives.
- Service-learning groups, made up of volunteers from youth groups, high schools, and universities, offer their own service to the Village. Bringing their unique ideas and worldview to our kids, they dedicate their efforts to hands-on work in the Village kitchen, on the farm, and in enrichment programming.



A HEALED HEART



ASYV's holistic programming transforms vulnerable youth into resilient change-makers who take on leadership roles in clubs and youth organizations, as class representatives at their universities, and in their home communities. 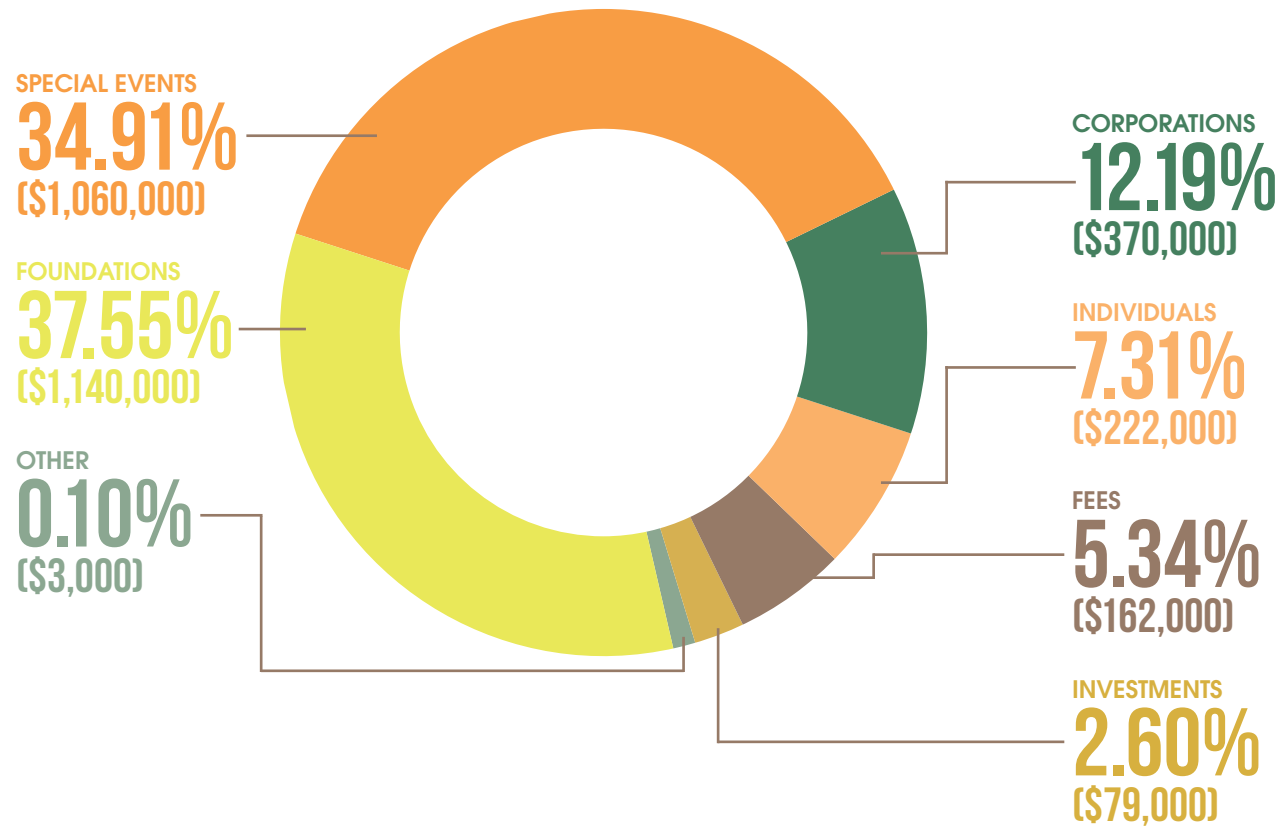

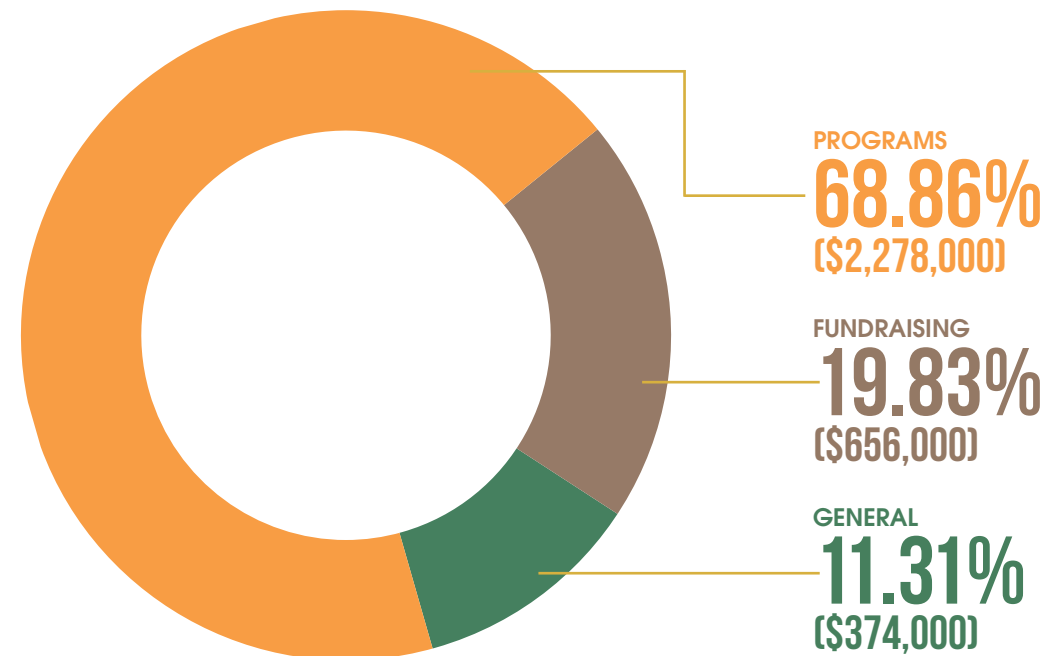
